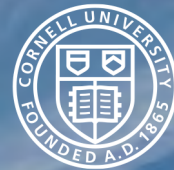

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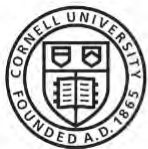

Cornell University

Founded in 1865 by Ezra Cornell and Andrew White, Cornell University is one of eight Ivy League universities and is located in the gorgeous city of Ithaca, New York. The founding principle of Cornell University by Ezra Cornell is "**I would found an institution where any person can find instruction in any study.**" To date, Cornell has about 240,000 alumni, and 61 Nobel laureates.

Connections between Cornell University and China began in the 1920s. Shi Hu, a famous historian of modern Chinese literature, and Yisheng Mao, a Chinese civil engineer, both studied at Cornell University. Hu Shi also gave Ithaca a beautiful Chinese name that signifies its beauty. Other famous alumni from China include Zhaoji Shi (a famous diplomat during the Republic of China era), Wanli Huang (an expert in water conservancy) and Yuanren Zhao (a famous linguist), etc.

The Cornell Institute for China Economic Research (CICER) was established and co-sponsored by the Cornell College of Business, the College of Arts and Sciences, and the Office of the Vice Provost for International Affairs.

CICER serves as a hub for Cornell expertise to conduct rigorous scientific research on China's economic and social issues. These world-renown experts are 21 Cornell faculty members from 6 different colleges across Cornell University.

CICER organizes activities in the following three areas:

Research: bringing together top researchers from Cornell and around the globe to study vital economic and social issues in China using state-of-the-art economic tools and big data.

Policy Engagement: promoting evidence-based policymaking by engaging in dialogue with government agencies, think tanks, and international organizations.

Education: providing opportunities for Cornell students to participate in research projects, hosting visiting scholars and graduate students, and offering training programs to college students, business leaders, and policymakers.

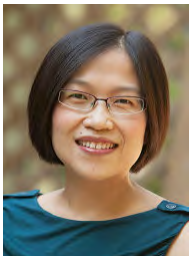

1 Ivy League Experiential Learning

- About 50 hours of live and interactive courses in economics, finance, big data and business analytics by prominent professors. Students will immerse in Ivy League experiential learning!
- Academic research seminars on economics and finance. Students will learn from outstanding researchers about generating innovative ideas and using state-of-the-art methods to conduct scientific research.
- Fun and practical business analysis simulation team competition to help students solidify understanding of knowledge learned in courses. Students learn to apply marketing strategy and business finance principles in the simulation. Every student will have an opportunity to present their team strategy, analysis of simulation results, and learning experience.



2 Graduate School & Career Planning

- U.S. Graduate School application workshop led by admission committee member.
- Consultation with faculty. Meet with faculty as a group or individually to inquire about academic pursuit, graduate school application or life goals.
- Panel discussions about career choices and working experience by successful industry leaders from the banking sector, renowned organizations, and/or start-up companies.
- Connections with Cornell faculty, Masters and Ph.D. students to learn about academic research, graduate school application, career planning, and other life experiences.



3 Field Trips
